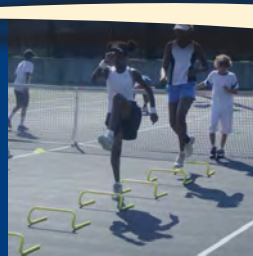
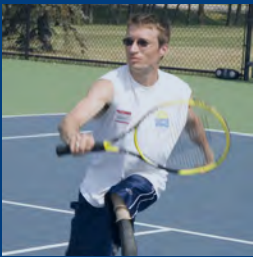

Whether reaching out to at-risk youngsters to provide positive role models and academic assistance, giving people with disabilities the opportunity to build fitness and self-esteem, or helping community programs use tennis as a motivator for school achievement, USTA Serves-supported programs around the country are using the powerful combination of tennis and education to help change lives.

In 2009, USTA Serves provided \$549,325 in grants to 37 programs. Each is unique, but all share a common mission: to help youngsters, most from underserved communities, grow into healthy, confident adults. By combining the lessons learned in tennis – hard work, discipline, working towards a goal – with ongoing academic support and mentoring, USTA Serves-supported programs successfully reach out to thousands of young people each year.

USTA Serves grants are awarded twice a year, chosen by a Grant Proposal Review Committee comprised of Foundation Board members and USTA national staff, with important input from USTA Sections. Because the USTA contributes to the administrative and operational costs of USTA Serves, its philanthropic arm, donor dollars can go directly to support deserving programs.

### Using Tennis to Change Lives

Since 1993, the Zina Garrison Tennis Academy, founded by tennis great and Houston native Zina Garrison and her coach John Wilkerson, has successfully combined tennis and education to reach more than 1200 kids a year from Houston's most underserved neighborhoods. A range of programs teach life skills and fitness, provide tutoring, and mentor youngsters, aged 4-18. Programs are free and operate in local city parks and schools. The Academy's mission is to change a youngster's life, and they are succeeding: 100% of the young people who stay in the program through high school go on to college, thanks to scholarships they've received.

### Proving that Tennis Is for Everyone

At OPAF, the goal is to help individuals who have lost limbs enjoy the rewards of physical fitness and the sense of personal achievement and social interaction that comes from participating in sports. Thanks to USTA Serves support, OPAF has been able to expand its First Volley program to Shriners Hospitals for Children across the country. First Volley introduces youngsters, aged 5-21, to tennis, most for the first time. The sense of achievement at learning to do something they thought was impossible, plus the comfort of sharing the experience with others who, like themselves, are physically challenged, has made the program a tremendous success, thus earning it the USTA Adaptive Tennis Community Service Award.

### Learning Life-Changing Skills Through Tennis

Thanks to USTA Serves funding, The King Street Center has been able to bring its *Kids on the Ball* program to hundreds of Burlington youth. The program teaches them tennis but goes way beyond that to help develop core values and life-long skills. Each summer, King Street takes *Kids on the Ball* into the local parks and in the winter the program has been integrated into the physical education curriculum of six city schools. King Street attracts youngsters from countries that range from Burma to Somalia, virtually all recent immigrants to America. For the many underserved kids who come to King Street, the Center is a haven and a hope, and tennis is an important part of what brings them in and keeps them coming back for more.

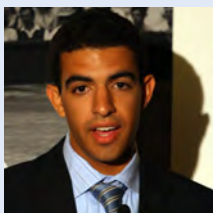

USTA *Serves* scholarships help outstanding young men and women from across the country who have demonstrated both a love of tennis and academic excellence go on to college. In 2009, we awarded 71 high school seniors with scholarships totaling \$379,000.

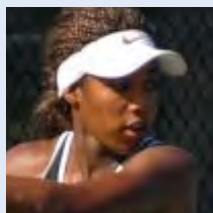
These student athletes represent each of the seventeen USTA Sections, and scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$15,000. USTA *Serves* acknowledges outstanding 6th - 11th graders with Player Incentive Awards that encourage continuing academic excellence and tennis participation.

USTA *Serves* scholarships honor some of our sport's most notable figures: Marian Wood Baird - long-standing USTA volunteer, Dwight Davis - founder of the Davis Cup, Eve Kraft - tennis pioneer, and Dwight Mosley - the first African-American member of the USTA Board. Their legacy lives on in these scholar athletes.

## LOOKING BACK WITH PRIDE... LOOKING AHEAD WITH EXCITEMENT

USTA Serves was founded as the philanthropic arm of the United States Tennis Association. The mission is simple and straightforward: to support, monitor and promote programs that enhance the lives of at-risk children and individuals with disabilities through the integration of tennis and education.

Over the past nine years, under the stewardship of retiring Chief Executive Karen Martin-Eliezer and the two Board Presidents who worked by her side, Pam Shriver and Patrick McEnroe, the USTA Serves/USTA partnership has grown stronger each year and resulted in many significant achievements.

In 2001, USTA Serves funded five programs. By the end of 2009 that number had grown to 180 with grants totaling over \$7.5 million -- in 136 cities nationwide. These programs reach thousands of young people every year, changing lives and enhancing communities.

Our college scholarship initiative has also grown dramatically. In 2001, 31 youngsters were provided with scholarship assistance. Over the next eight years, that number grew to 603 outstanding young men and women, receiving nearly \$2.5 million in scholarships.

As we plan for an exciting future, we're proud to look back at some of the outstanding highlights of the past nine years:

### Making College Scholarships Available through Corporate Partnerships

From 2005-2008, MassMutual Foundation support enabled USTA Serves to provide at least two \$5,000 college scholarship for each of the seventeen USTA Sections, in addition to the scholarships the Foundation already had in place. When the MassMutual grant ended, USTA Serves continued to provide funding for an average of 80 scholarships per year.



### Supporting the Best New Programming

The National Junior Tennis & Learning (NJTL) network and First Serve represent two major programs that USTA Serves is proud to support. At the end of 2009, First Serve officially became part of the USTA. We are excited about the opportunity both of these networks have for developing and sustaining programs that combine tennis and education in innovative ways that have the potential to change a child's life.

### Community-Building Through Tennis

A three-year Ford Foundation/ National Junior Tennis & Learning Network (USTA NJTL)/USTA Serves partnership helped NJTL chapters in Memphis, Philadelphia, Jacksonville, Milwaukee, and Boston demonstrate that both traditional and non-traditional tennis facilities can be vital community resources in any urban regeneration strategy. Innovative programming brought together community partnerships that focused on reducing childhood obesity and increasing the interaction between racial and economic classes. The Ford Foundation invested \$850,000 in the project.

### Leveling the Healthcare Playing Field for At-Risk Youngsters

D.E.U.C.E. – Disparity Elimination Using Care and Exercise – provided funding to programs around the country to use tennis as the vehicle for better health and fitness. Working with the Aetna Foundation, and other corporate partners, D.E.U.C.E. successfully helped young people in underserved communities gain equal access to health services that could combat obesity and the growing epidemic of childhood diabetes.

### A Name that Best Reflects Our Mission

Though our name changed – we began as the USTA Foundation, evolving to the USTA Tennis & Education Foundation, and in 2008 officially became USTA Serves - Foundation for **Academics, Character, Excellence** – our goal remained the same: to help youngsters serve 'ACES' on and off the court.

### Opening Tennis to People with Disabilities

A key part of the USTA Serves mission is to help people with disabilities participate in the sport we love. Since 2001, over \$375,000 in program grants has been awarded to 15 adaptive tennis programs around the country, reaching both adults and youngsters with a range of disabilities.

### Generating Corporate Support

Over the past nine years, USTA Serves has been fortunate to receive funding from a number of major corporate supporters – including Aetna, American Express, ConAgra Foods, Evian, Ford Foundation, Heineken, Hess Corporation, Niarchos, Pepsi, Quad Graphics and Staples -- enabling us to expand both our program and scholarship support.

### Increasing Donations Through On-Line Giving

In 2006, USTA Serves giving went on-line ([www.usta.com/foundation](http://www.usta.com/foundation)). Our website not only provides information about Foundation activities, it allows supporters to donate on-line. What's more, when USTA members renew on-line, they are able to support USTA Serves with a voluntary donation – 50% of which goes to their USTA Section Foundation, a win/win for everyone.



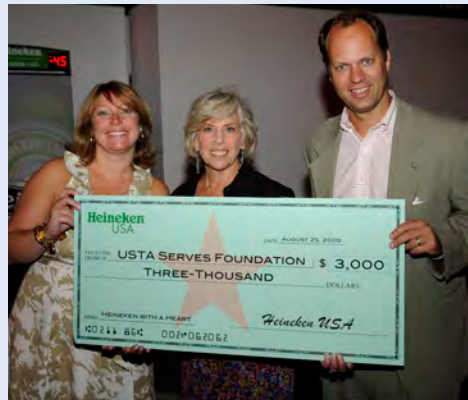

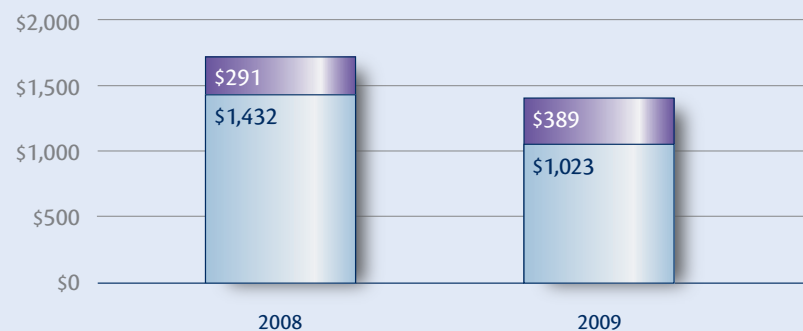
