Dear Official:

Your 2009 data applies to your 2010 certification. USTA umpire certification levels are active for a calendar year.

2009 SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

The school requirements for 2009 are the same as in 2008.

1. National and Professional Line Umpires, Chair Umpires, and Referees are exempt from schools and tests in 2009 **UNLESS**, you hold an ITA certification or an additional certification at the USTA level or below.
2. If you have a certification level other than NL, NC, CN, NR, PL, PC, CP or PR you must attend a USTA school and pass the appropriate tests.

USTA SCHOOL DETAILS for 2009:

1. **ALL** tests are open book and offered on line. The tests should be taken at home **BEFORE COMING TO CLASS** and must be **BROUGHT TO CLASS** with you. **Please note that all questions on the test will be based on information found in the 2008 edition of Friend at Court.**
2. You **MUST PRE REGISTER** through your Sectional or District Chairperson in order to attend any school taught by a National Trainer-Evaluator.
3. School format: (Times may vary slightly depending on location)
 - a. Saturday (8-12) USTA school for those certified 3 years or more
 - b. Saturday (1-3) Referee school
 - c. Saturday (3:15-5:15) ITA
 - d. Sunday (8-1) USTA school for those not previously certified and those certified for less than 3 years.

Please note that no one should attend any schools on Saturday unless they have been previously certified.

If you have any questions regarding school requirements, please contact your Sectional Chairperson or the National Chairperson so that you can fulfill all requirements in a timely fashion.

As in the past, the following conditions apply to ITA and referee certifications:

1. **ITA-** any official who wishes to be certified as an ITA official must annually attend an ITA school and pass the ITA test. In addition, since USTA rules apply to anything not specifically superceded by ITA,NCAA,NAIA, or conference rules, officials applying for ITA certification must also attend a USTA school and pass the USTA test. Being versed in all sets of rules is vital.
2. **Referee-** Those officials who wish to be certified as referees must annually attend the referee school and pass the referee test. They must also attend the USTA school and pass the USTA test. The referee must be versed in all rules and accepted procedures and must be as knowledgeable, if not more so, than the officials they supervise or work with. We strongly recommend that those attending the referee classes have several years of umpiring experience.

Certification Cards

Enclosed is your 2009 USTA Officials certification card. Please review the card for certification level accuracy. If you have any questions regarding your certification levels, contact your sectional chair of officials immediately. An outline for appealing your certification level can be found in USTA Regulations XV.I of the 2008 Friend at Court. The deadline for appeals is **March 1, 2009 after which certification level changes will not be made.**

***- Please note the new USTA umpire certification level for Roving Umpire that began in 2008 will not appear on the certification card. If you think you have qualified for this Roving certification, check with your Section Chair and add the certification to your card.**

Vision Requirement

The 2009 Officials Data Card requires a Doctor's signature to attest to 20/20 vision, corrected or uncorrected. This must be completed by all officials in order to receive a 2010 certification.

2010 Certification

In 2010, the USTA will transition into a new data base. Starting in 2010, officials will register and maintain their work record on line. For many selected events, the referee and/or chief umpire will enter the work record of officials on line. For other smaller events, each official will enter their work record on line. 2009 will be the last year that officials will use a hard copy of the data card. **(NOTE: The 2009 Officials Data card must still be sent into the Section/District Chairs by October 15, 2009.)** Detailed information on the new data base and the method of registration and the maintenance of an officials work record will be sent to all certified officials by mid year, 2009. Support and training of the new data base will be available during the second half of 2009.

USTA Officials Department Update

At the end of 2008, Ryan Orner will no longer be with the USTA. Ryan moved to Las Vegas at the beginning of 2008 and continued to work with us at the USTA throughout 2008. For nearly a decade Ryan has worked for the USTA Officials Department contributing to the growth and development of USTA Officiating with his hard work and remarkable efficiency. All of us wish Ryan well with his future endeavors.

USTA Official's Code of Conduct

Over the past 2 years the USTA Officials Department has been working to achieve a more consistent form of communication and record keeping for addressing Official's Code of Conduct issues. All Chief umpires at USTA Pro Circuit tournaments, National Championships, or any other events that retain the services of USTA certified officials from multiple sections must complete a report form at the end of the event. The completed form is submitted to the USTA Officials Department.

The USTA Officials Department will collect and maintain data on Official's Code of Conduct issues that are reported, research these complaints, inform those individual USTA certified officials of patterns of behavior that are problematic, and make recommendations to the National Chairperson of the USTA Officials Committee when de-certification is deemed necessary. The goal is to ensure the fair and consistent handling of all USTA Official's Code of Conduct issues.

2009 US OPEN application forms will **NOT** be mailed out to officials.

Officials who held a USTA Line Umpire, USTA Chair Umpire or higher certification level in 2009 are eligible to apply directly for 2009 US Open. All other USTA Certified officials must receive a written or typed recommendation from either their Sectional Chairperson or a National Trainer/Evaluator. A recommendation should be sent directly to the USTA office by the T-E and/or sectional chair.

David Littlefield- winner of the prestigious McGovern Award for a lifetime of dedication, service, and expertise to tennis officiating.

Kevin Labor- winner of the Jack Stahr Award for outstanding work as a line umpire in his first three years at the US Open.

Umpire Clothing

USTA Officials Wild Card Assignments at ATP Tour events:

In 2009, the ATP Tour will again offer a few assignments to officials who lack ratings and/or experience.

To qualifying for consideration for these few assignments, all officials must enter their availability with the ATP for each event. Those not selected for an event will automatically be considered for a wild card assignment. The USTA will not accept individual requests for Wild Cards in 2009. To be considered, you must make yourself available with the ATP by filling out and sending in to the ATP the ATP Availability Form.
