It is with great pleasure that I take this opportunity to invite your club to host a **2010 Pilot Pen Tennis Family Classic Event**. These tournaments provide an exciting occasion for parent/child teams and husband/wife throughout New England and New York to engage in friendly competition, to win prizes, and to have a chance to advance to the Regional Tournament and Family Classic Finals played on site at Pilot Pen Tennis next summer. Again this year, the local tournaments will be open to tennis organizations throughout New England and New York who wish to participate in Family Classic.

Here are some highlights of the 2009 Pilot Pen Tennis Family Classic:

- **Over 5,000 people all over New England and New York competed in the Family Classic**
- **The winners (140 teams) competed in the regional championships in late July.**
- **Fun and Prizes!** Last year, not only did all participants receive a Family Classic T-shirt and a chance to win raffle prizes including **Pilot Pen Tickets & US Open Tickets!**
- The **Family Classic Finals** were played during the Pilot Pen Tennis Tournament. Family Classic winners and finalists were **honored on Stadium Court** with trophy presentations from **Amelie Mauresmo & Sam Querrey**, ATP & WTA Players!
- **Easy to Run Local Events:** Clubs and Recreation Departments collect any/all fees charged to participants. Clubs also determine the format and scoring that best suits their own event.

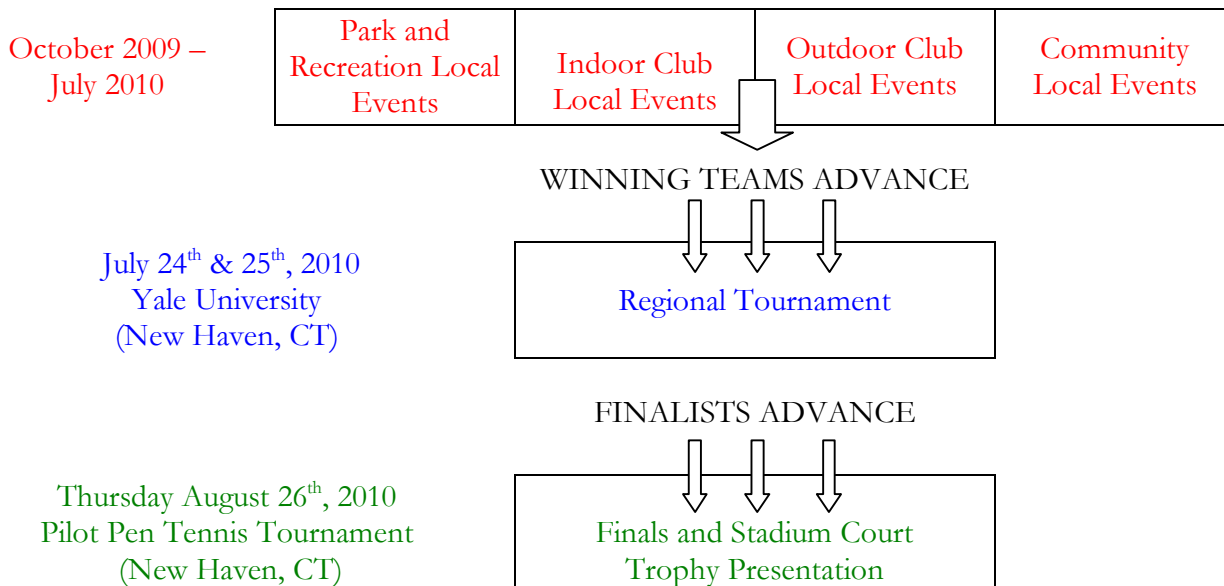
Enclosed is a more detailed outline describing the procedures to run a local Family Classic Event.

How to Run Your Local Event:

1. **CHOOSE A DATE** before July 20th, 2010. I will post your club, phone number and the date of your tournament announcing your event on the official Pilot Pen Website. To gain revenue, you might want to open your event to the public. We will also send out press releases to local newspapers, announcing your event (if it is open to the public).
2. **Complimentary MARKETING MATERIALS** will be sent to you to help promote your event. (Banner, Posters, Sign-up Sheets, T-shirts, Raffle forms (to win box-seat tickets to Pilot Pen))
3. **RUN YOUR EVENT USING A FORMAT OF YOUR CHOICE.** The format you use is entirely up to you (standard draw, round robin, pro-sets, regular-sets, etc.) depending on the participants, number of courts, and time allotted for the event. Generally, clubs have been charging between \$25 and \$35 per team to enter. Entry fees are yours to keep!
4. **DON'T FORGET THE RAFFLE!** Enter all your participants in a raffle drawing for two box seats and pull it at the tournament! Have the winning team choose the session of their choice and send the certificate to me so that I can send them their complimentary tickets.
5. **Pass out the regional information packets** to the winners of each division. This is their entry form into the regional tournament being held in late July! The regional draws will be posted July 22nd.
6. **REPORT YOUR RESULTS TO Matt Fraenza** via fax to 203-772-4647 or call 203-781-5811 Just fill out the local winner form provided to you and send it in by July 20th. We'll post your club's results on our website and push out a press release to your local papers.

1. **Divisions**

- a. Father-Child (12 & Under)
- b. Father-Child (14 & Under)
- c. Father-Child (18 & Under)
- d. Mother-Child (12 & Under)
- e. Mother-Child (14 & Under)
- f. Mother-Child (18 & Under)
- g. Husband–Wife
- h. Parent-Child Open (19 & Over)

2. **ELIGIBILITY/RULES**

a. **Parent-Child Teams**

- i. **CHILDREN** must play with their **PARENT, GRANDPARENT, or LEGAL GUARDIAN**
- ii. **CHILD’S AGE** is based on their **AGE ON THE DATE OF THE LOCAL EVENT PLAYED**
- iii. Anyone with a **TOP-30 USTA New England JUNIOR STANDING MUST play up 1 age division or in the Parent/Child Open Division.**
- iv. Teams may compete in **only one** Pilot Pen Tennis Family Classic event. If a team wins more than one local event in any division, the **RUNNER-UP TEAM WILL ADVANCE** to the Regional Tournament.
- v. The **AGE-ELIGIBILITY** of the child is based upon their age on JULY 1st (Note: This is different than past years) Ex. if your child was 14 on the day you won your local Pilot Pen Tennis Family Classic event, but turns 15 before July 1st, they must compete in the 18/Under division)

b. **Husband-Wife Teams**

- i. Participants must currently be married to each other on the date of the local event played.

c. **Parent Child Open Teams**

- i. Our newest division; we are looking for parent child teams over the age of 18 to participate in this field or outstanding juniors who are not eligible in their age division due to their current USTA ranking.

d. **All Top 30 USTA NE Ranked Juniors**

- i. A USTA NE top 30 ranked junior may not compete in their age division, however they may play up 1 division. For example: a 12 and under top ranked junior may play up to the 14’s division. However, an 18 and under top ranked junior must play up in the open division.

*You may **run as few as one (1) of these divisions, or as many as all eight (8) of these divisions** depending on the number of participants and format that works best for your event.

*You may **combine parent-child divisions** if you have a limited number of participants. **Ex)** Run a draw with Mother-Child 12&U, and Father-Child 12&U. Even if an FC12 team wins the draw, the MC12 team who advanced the furthest in the draw would also be eligible to advance to the Regional Tournament.
