USTA NorCal Point Penalty Suspension System

The purpose of the USTA NorCal Point Penalty Suspension System is to maintain fair and reasonable standards of conduct by all USTA NorCal players competing in any USTA-sanctioned tournament.

SUMMARY OF NEW RULES FOR 2012:

- This version of the USTA NorCal Point Penalty Suspension System has been conformed to a numbered and lettered outline for easier reference. Some conforming changes that do not affect the substance of the policy have been made.
- The policy has been amended to clarify that all suspension points issued to a NorCal player that competes outside of NorCal (national USTA, Sectional, District, ITF) will count as points in the USTA NorCal Point Penalty Suspension System. (Rule A and the Suspension Point Table) (Effective 1/1/12)
- The procedure for reporting violations to the Referee has been amended to allow the reporting of incidents that are seen, heard, or otherwise observed enough to be able to determine with reasonable certainty that a violation has taken place. (Rule B) (Effective 1/1/12)
- The rules clarify that USTA NorCal staff has the authority to assess suspension points when a staff member discovers that a player has violated the Concurrent Tournament Rule (Rule D) (Effective 1/1/12)
- Suspension Points shall no longer be levied against a doubles partner who was not responsible for a violation. (Rule E) (Effective 1/1/12)
- The requirements or submitting Code of Conduct Reports have been amended (Rule F) (Effective 1/1/12)
- Separate letters from USTA NorCal staff are no longer required to be sent to a player after each time a suspension point is assessed. (Effective 1/1/12)
- The No Show Default Policy has been clarified to bring it into compliance with the definition of a No Show Default that is in the USTA Regulations. (Rule L) (Effective 1/1/12)
- The Suspension Point Table has been amended re-define certain violations and add several new violations that are consistent with the standards of conduct in the USTA Regulations. (Effective 1/1/12)

A. Application. The USTA NorCal Point Penalty Suspension System shall apply to tournaments sanctioned by USTA NorCal. It applies to conduct:

- During all matches (main draw, compass draw, consolation, qualifying, and doubles);
- During tournament activities;
- At tournament facilities; and
- At facilities, such as hotels, dormitories, and homes where players stay.

Additionally each suspension point assessed at USTA national tournaments, tournaments sanctioned by another Sectional Association or District Association, and ITF tournaments becomes one suspension point under the USTA NorCal Point Penalty Suspension System.

For junior players, Suspension Points assessed by USTA NorCal shall count as one point in the national Suspension Point System.

B. Persons Authorized to Report Violations to Referee. The following persons are authorized to report violations of the USTA Regulations and USTA NorCal Rules to the Referee for offenses they have seen, heard, or otherwise observed enough to be able to determine with reasonable certainty a that a violation has occurred:

- Tournament Committee members
- Chief Umpire
- Deputy Referees
- On-court officials (including Roving Officials)
- Court Monitors, if specifically authorized by the Referee
- Club or facility managers
- Hotel or dormitory managers
- Families housing players
- Sectional or national junior staff

C. Treatment of Coaches, Player Relatives, and Player Representatives. Abusive conduct on the part of a player's coach, relative, representative or any other person associated with the person including conduct directed toward any player, tournament official or spectator, shall be considered a violation and penalties may be assessed to a player. Violations may result in denial of privileges or exclusion of such person(s) from any or all USTA sanctioned tournaments in USTA NorCal or such other sanctions as the Junior Council or Sportsmanship Committee may impose.

- D. Persons Authorized to Assess Suspension Points.** Suspension Points are assessed by the Referee or, in the case of cases involving violation of the Concurrent Tournament Rule, USTA NorCal staff. Suspension points are not assessed by the Tournament Director, Roving Umpires, Chair Umpires, or Line Umpires.
- E. Suspension Points.** Suspension Points shall be assessed as set forth in the **Suspension Point Table**. When a violation occurs that involves a doubles team, suspension points shall be assessed only to the doubles player who was responsible for the violation. For example, if only one partner caused a default for lateness, or if only one partner's behavior resulted in code violations under the Point Penalty System, only that partner shall be assessed suspension points. If, however, both the behavior of both partners contributed to a default under the Point Penalty System, both partners shall be assessed suspension points.
- F. Submission of Code of Conduct Reports.** Within three days after the end of a tournament, the Referee shall file with USTA NorCal, Code of Conduct Reports for all violations of USTA Regulations and USTA NorCal Rules, which shall include the Suspension Points assessed for violations listed in the **Suspension Point Table**. Players shall be given a copy of the report during the tournament, if possible, otherwise the report will be sent to the player within three days after the end of the tournament.
- When USTA NorCal staff assesses Suspension Points for a violation of the Concurrent Tournament Rule, players shall be sent a report as soon as possible thereafter.
- Failure of the Referee to file the report with USTA NorCal or for a report to be sent to the player within three days after the end of a tournament shall not invalidate any post-tournament disciplinary action, nor shall it invalidate any penalties imposed.
- G. Player's Responsibility to Track Suspension Points.** It is a player's responsibility to track their Suspension Points.
- H. Player Suspension.** USTA NorCal shall suspend players according to the following schedule:
- 1. First Suspension.** If a player receives 10 suspension points within a 12-month period, the player shall be suspended from competing in USTA-sanctioned tournaments for three months. Upon suspension these 10 points shall be cleared from the player's record. All other suspension points shall remain on the player's record and count towards a second suspension.
In the case of a junior player, the national suspension point system states that if no USTA National Championship falls during the 3-month period, the junior player shall not be accepted into the USTA National Championship immediately following the 3-month suspension period.
 - 2. Second Suspension.** If a player receives 8 suspension points within the 12 months immediately following the first suspension, the player shall be suspended from competing in USTA-sanctioned tournaments for six months. Upon suspension these 8 points shall be cleared from the player's record. All other suspension points shall remain on the player's record and count towards a third suspension.
 - 3. Subsequent Suspensions.** If a player receives 6 suspension points within the 12-month period immediately following the second suspension (and any suspensions subsequent to the second suspension), the player shall be suspended from competing in USTA-sanctioned tournaments for a one year. Upon suspension these 6 points shall be cleared from the player's record. All other suspension points shall remain on the player's record and count towards a subsequent suspension.
In the case of a junior player, the player shall lose eligibility for endorsement into any USTA national tournaments for the remainder of the player's eligibility in junior tennis.
- I. Notice to Tournaments and Written Notice to Player of Suspension.** After USTA NorCal has determined that a player is to be suspended, USTA NorCal staff shall post the player's name on the website to inform Tournament Committees of players that may not compete in a USTA tournament. The Chairman or the Chairman's designee shall send a notice by first class mail and by certified mail (return receipt requested) to the player at the address shown on the records of the USTA Membership Department. The notice shall set forth:
- That the player is being suspended;
 - The length of the suspension;
 - The player's right to appeal the suspension;
 - The procedure for appealing the suspension; and
 - A statement that if the player chooses not to appeal the suspension, then the suspension shall begin 21 days after the date the notice was mailed.
- J. Right to Appeal Suspension to Sportsmanship Committee and Request Hearing.**
- 1. Request for Hearing.** A player shall have the right to appeal a suspension by requesting a hearing before the Sportsmanship Committee. Absent good cause shown, any appeal shall be barred unless it is made in writing within 15 days of the mailing the notice of suspension and shall be sent by certified mail, return

receipt requested, to the Sportsmanship Committee Chairperson, c/o USTA NorCal, 1920 North Loop Road, Alameda, CA 94502.

2. *Decision of Sportsmanship Committee.* Whenever a quorum is present, the vote of a majority of the members present shall constitute the decision of an appeal by the Sportsmanship Committee. The Sportsmanship Committee shall make a decision on an appeal within 20 days of the date of the hearing and the decision shall be binding and final. The Chairman, or the Chairman's designee shall prepare a written decision of the Committee notifying all parties of the decision.

K. Effective Date of Suspension.

1. If an appeal of a suspension is not made to the Sportsmanship Committee, the suspension begins 16 days after the certified notice of suspension is mailed to the player.
2. If an appeal of the suspension is made to the Sportsmanship Committee and the suspension is upheld, the suspension begins on the date one day after the decision is made by the Sportsmanship Committee.

L. No Show Default Policy. If a player receives a Default, No Show, the player shall be suspended from USTA NorCal tournament competition for a period of 30 days. The player shall have the right to appeal a suspension by requesting a hearing before the Sportsmanship Committee. Absent good cause shown, any appeal shall be barred unless it is made in writing within 10 days of the mailing the notice of suspension, and shall be mailed first class, certified, or registered mail to the Sportsmanship Committee Chairperson, c/o USTA NorCal, 1920 North Loop Road, Alameda, CA 94502.

Each code violation under the USTA Point Penalty System (point, game, or default) except that players who receive code violations because of delay immediately after a medical timeout or because of obvious cramping are not assessed suspension points.	2
Default for flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct on or off the court	8
Default for refusal to play or continue to play (for reason other than illness injury, or personal circumstance)	5
Default because of an adult discipline	5
Default for lateness	1
Disqualification for ineligibility	3
*Suspension points for defaults are in addition to points previously assessed for code violations.
