

The USTA/Mid-Atlantic Section Junior Competition Committee has initiated changes to the Section ranking system that will help players progress on the pathway to a national ranking. As part of the changes, events on the national junior tournament schedule will count toward section ranking. This requires realignment in the designation of MAS Section tournament levels and the associated point charts. Although it may be confusing at first, the new levels should simplify tournament naming, especially for events that count for national points. Please see the chart below:

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**Jr. Team Tennis**

Jr. Team Tennis (JTT) events are organized and run separately from the regular junior tournament structure which deals exclusively with individual and doubles tournament play (see the section on JTT on the Mid-Atlantic website). However, players in the Intermediate and Advanced JTT District and Sectional Championship events will earn points toward their Mid-Atlantic Standings/Rankings. The point schedule for points earned is as follows:

District Championship: 40 points per match to a maximum of 240 points

Section Championship: 65 points per match to a maximum of 390 points
