USTA BOYS 18 TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS (Urbana, IL Aug 3-6)

Dave Schwarz (Middlebury, VT)

- Dave enters his 10th year as head coach of the men's tennis program at Middlebury. In nine seasons, Schwarz has led the Panthers to national prominence with an impressive 151-35 record. He led the team to four consecutive NESCAC titles ('04-'07) as well as seven straight trips to the NCAA final four. The '04 squad captured the school's first NCAA Tennis Championship, while the '06 and '07 squads set school records with 22 wins.
- Following the team's national crown in '04, Schwarz was named the ITA Division III National Coach of the Year. He is also a three-time selection ('02, '04, '07) as the NESCAC Coach of the Year. Schwarz was named the ITA Regional Coach of the Year in '09.
