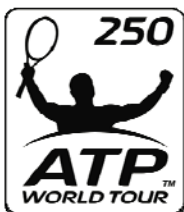

Welcome Back to Atlanta!

After nearly a decade without a men's professional tennis tournament, Atlanta will finally play host to another ATP World Tour event. The Atlanta Tennis Championships, owned and operated by USTA Southern, serves as the kick-off to the 2010 Olympus US Open Series, which consists of ten tournaments across North America.

Over the weekend, the Atlanta Athletic Club saw more than 5,000 spectators enter the grounds to watch the first two qualifying rounds, greatly exceeding expectations.

Today, spectators will witness action from all three draws. The four remaining qualifying matches will be played to finalize the main singles draw; No. 6 seed Mardy Fish headlines opening round play; and Americans John Isner and James Blake will face fellow countrymen Robby Ginepri and Ryan Sweeting this evening.
